

July 24th 1800 Surveyed for Michael Stoner two hundred acres of second rate land by virtue of a certificate No 65 removed from a military survey according to law and located on the south side of Cumberland River, in the County of Pulasky beginning on two white oaks near Sharps corner thence running North 65° west 80 poles to a stake on Joseph Bands line about four poles below the improvement thence with said Bands line South 80° W. 200 poles passing said Bands corner to a Black oak and white oak thence South 20° East 87 poles to two white oaks thence South 65° East 179 poles to a post oak near Sharps line thence North 25° East 179 poles to the Beginning

Sharp in a known wilful and fraudulent

manner with a view to divest the said
William Sharp of the improvement —

^{2nd} Because he the Said William Sharp Claims
the same Land at the State price upon
the principles held out to Settlers South
of Green River having improved and Planted
Corn two late to procure a certificate for
said Land at the last arrangement and
preparing for the next — William Sharp

Oath that he files this Caveat above for the purpose
and with a view to procure the said Land for his
bonfide purpose and not with a view to combine with
said Stoner nor no person for him

Let no grant issue to Elizabeth Sharp her Warior
assigne for the hundred Acres of second rate land lying
and being in the County of Wayne which 100 Acres is foun-
der on part Head right certificate No 3443 Surveyed the 21st
day of August 1801 and Registered the 22nd day of March
1802 adjoining Mr Sharps Land and the land of Joseph Bonds.

Because Michael Stoner claims the said land by virtue of
a certificate granted by the commissary No 65 under which
the said Michael Stoner had a legal survey made on said
land on the twenty fourth July 1800 returned the same to the
Registers office and on the 20 day of July 1801 obtained a
patent in his own name for the land aforesaid which so
patent bears date prior to the said Sharp locating his
certificate wherein the said Sharp having knowledge of his
the said Stoners claim.
And Because Mr Sharp did on the 22nd day of February 1800
enter a Caveat against the said Stoners survey thereby intent-
ing to deprive him of his first right which said Caveat was
lodged in the Quarter Session Court for the County of Cumberland
and said court determined that the better right was in S^r Stoner
under which decree S^r Stoner obtained his Patent for said Land.
And Because Mr Sharp being unsuccessfull in the decision
on that caveat furnished a part of a certificate No 3443
and caused the same to be signed to the said Elizabeth
Sharp in whose name the land has been Surveyed with an in-
tent to defraud him the said Stoner of the said land.

expended.
