 25 Sept. 1801. or parcel of land containing two hundred acres by  
 Survey bearing date the twentieth day of May 1788  
 lying and being in the District set apart for the  
 Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia State line on  
 the south side of Cumberland river about three  
 miles from Prices Landing and about one and  
 a half miles from the meadows and bounded  
 as followeth To wit Beginning at an ash &  
 White Oak on a hill thence north sixty one degrees  
 East one hundred and eighty two Poles crossing  
 a small branch to a red oak & forsimon tree  
 thence north fifteen degrees east one hundred  
 & eighty two Poles to two white Oaks and a Red Oak  
 thence south sixty one degrees East one hundred  
 and eighty two Poles crossing a branch to a red oak  
 thence south fifteen degrees west one hundred and  
 eighty two Poles to the beginning with appur-  
 tenances to have and to hold the said tract or parcel  
 of land with its appurtenances to the said Andrew  
 Tribble and his heirs forever in Witness whereof  
 the said James Raliff Esquire Governor of
