Evidently, originally the Rev War pension office was located in Philadelphia, thus the appearance on Pennsylvania ledger, even though his application and other records show he was from Virginia and originally on Virginia Line. Later perhaps in Pennsylvania as soldier with St. Clair. Note the confusion in some of the records stating his name as James, when this note says that was error and his name was John. This note evidently in connection with app for a replacement pension certificate in 1821.
