This deed of conveyance, made and entered into this 29th day of December 1892, between Louisia J. Colyer and C. G. Colyer her husband and J. F. Meece and Lucy J. Meece his wife parties of the first part and T. P. Meece party of the second part,

Witnesseth: That said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of an amicable division of the Real Estate inherited by us from our parents, without cost

The said land being willed from Wm. Richardson to Matilda Meece and Epraim Meece her husband and their heirs. The said grantee agrees to join with each of the above named parties in granting the other party his part of said land, do hereby sell and convey to the party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, the following described property, to-wit:

One tract of land lying in the County of Pulaski and State of Ky and on the water of Pitman Creek bounded as follows: Beginning at a Sugar tree and Pin Oak corner between James Sears and the Meece farm. Thence S. 86 1/4 E 24 C. to a gum, said Sears' corner. Thence N 50 W 3.50 C to a Stone, where an old corner supposed to have been, thence N 40 3/4 E 12.50 C to two hickories and ironwood, thence N 45 W 26.25 C. to a white oak and ash, (white oak down) thence South 32 W 12.75 C to a beech where a beech and three sugar tree once stood (old corner) thence N 85 W 9-25 C to a stone in the field, thence N 58 3/4 W 10.40 C to a stone in Sear's line, thence S 19 W 16.60 C to a stone on the line between Sears and Meece, thence S 89 E 20.75 C to a stone on the E side of the Dry Branch, thence S 11 W 7.50 C to the beginning.

It is understood that the aboved described tract includes said T. P. Meece's shair and William M. Meece's shair which was conveyed from said William Meece to said T. P. Meece.

To have and to hold the same, together with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging, unto the party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever. And the said party of the first part hereby covenants with the said party of the second part, that we will warrant the title to the property hereby conveyed unto the said
