William Colyar, b ca 1756, Montgomery Co., near Roanoke, Virginia, died ca 1819 Washington Co., TN, believed to be son of a John Colyar. Married to "Nancy" Ann St. Clair, supposedly sister to General Arthur St. Clair, (who came to America in 1757 with the British Army, resigned his commission in 1762, settling in the Ligonier Valley of Pennsylvania.
