This was to settle with Alexander Colyer (son of Wm. Colyer, Sr. ??)
The person involved must be William Colyer, Jr. Note here is stated William Colyer died 11 Feb. 1825. Wm. Jr???

I have looked at some of the other books you mentioned - one Book 7 p 98 was Charles Colyer to Gutridge Garland 600-acre grant in Limestone Cove, (now Unicoi Co., TN - formed 1875 from Washington Co.) Colyer must have gotten the grant from another person who had received it and no longer wanted it then sold to Gutridge Garland, one of the earliest settlers who evidently thought he was still in NC - long history on this man.

Some of the other references were merely witnesses, etc. I will go over all you sent in the near future and let you know my findings.

I tried to call last night to see if I had the most important part for you, but received no answer.

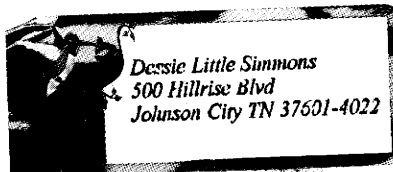
When we past Book 6, I doubt we will find anything more about William Collier/Collyer, etc, Sr.
