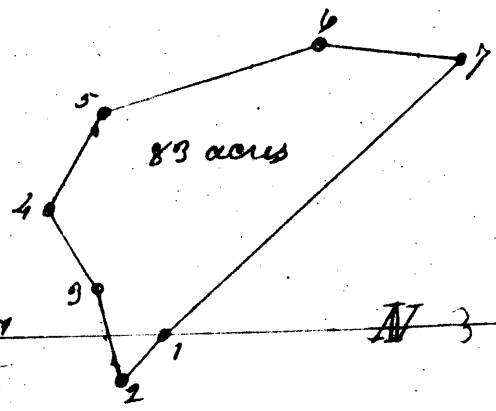

GOVERNOR OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY:

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

KNOW YE, That by virtue and in consideration of part of a warrant from the Pulaski County Court, there is granted by the said Commonwealth, unto Bluford Colyer

a certain tract or parcel of Land, containing eighty three Acres, by survey, bearing date the 3<sup>d</sup> day of September one thousand eight hundred and forty five lying and being in the County of Pulaski on

the waters of Cumberland river and bounded as followeth to wit Beginning at two black oaks his old corner thence his line S45° E34 poles to a white oak his corner thence S76° W52 poles to a gum thence S58° W50 poles to a dogwood and black oak thence N60° W58 poles to a white oak thence N16° W12 poles to a poplar thence N77° E74 poles to a poplar thence S41° E210 poles to the Beginning

With its appurtenances: To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land, with its appurtenances to the said

Bluford Colyer and his heirs forever.
