I do hereby Acknowledge that I have conveyed and sold to Henry
McKinney all my right title and claim to the above named tract of
land. Yet nothing herein shall ever be so construed as to make and the
said McGuerry Accountable for loss by any previous title or claim or
responsible in any way for expences or losses which Henry McKinney
may suffer in the aforesaid tract of land

26th day of July 1851 - Between William Purvis heir at Law and legal repres-
entative of William Purvis Dec^d of the county of Pulaski and State of Kentucky
of the one part and John Colyer Sen^r of the County and State aforesaid
of the other part witnesseth that the said William Purvis has this day
for and in consideration of the sum of _____ dollars bargained and sold
and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and claim to the said John
Colyer his heirs or assigns forever all the right title interest and claim
which descended to him from his father the said William Purvis Dec^d
in and to a certain tract or parcel of land - Situate in the County of
Pulaski and the waters of Buck creek containing Fifty Acres. to the same
more or less being the same tract of Land conveyed by Deed of Gift
from James Purvis to said William Purvis Dec^d by deed now of
Record in the Clerks office of the Pulaski County Court & afterwards
conveyed by Deed of Conveyance from said James Purvis to John W
Haris to the aforesaid John Colyer Sen^r and bounded as follows to-wit-

 Mcnamara and Mary his wife for the consideration of two hundred
 and fifty Dollars a part of which has heretofore been paid and for
 the balance (about) about \$100 besides interest and cost Melinda
 Elliot now has a judgment for in the Pulaski Circuit Court hath
 granted bargain and sale and by these presents doth grant bargain
 sell conveyance and confirm unto the said George B. Harwin
 and his heirs two certain Lots of Ground lying and being in the
 Town of Somerset Ky. on Spring brook street or Leona brook street
 South from the square and designated as the plot of said town
 as Nos 45 & 48 and is that part of said Lots which lies between said
 brook street and that part which was conveyed by commission of the
 Pulaski Circuit Court for and on behalf of John Harwin to William Watt
 Except that portion whereon stands the Masonic Hall building and as much
 two feet back of said building which is not conveyed by this Deed and is
 the same lot heretofore sold and conveyed by Jenkins Vickery & wife to
 said Mcnamara by deed bearing date the 11th day of February 1845 to which
 said Mcnamara is hereunto for greater certainty
