W^m Mc Kinneys corner thence S. 55° poles to a Walnut tree & so east
192 poles to a pine oak supposed to be in the line of W^m Mc McGuirey & thence
N 54° E. Suppose 44 poles to a white Oak & hickory W^m Mc Kinneys corner
thence N 68° W. 200 poles to the Beginning

I do hereby Acknowledge that I have conveyed and sold to Henry
McKinney all my right title and claim to the above named tract of
land. Yet nothing herein shall ever be so construed as to make me the
Said Mc McGuirey accountable for loss by any previous title or claim or
responsible in any way for difficulties or losses which Henry McKinney
may suffer in the aforesaid tract of land

26th day of July 1851 - Between William Purvis their at law and legal Repre-
sentative of William Purvis Esq^r of the County of Pulaski and State of Kentucky
of the one part and John Colby Jr. son of the County and State aforesaid
to the other part witnesseth that the said William Purvis has this day
for and in consideration of the sum of dollars bargain and sold
And by these presents doth grant bargain sell and claim to the said John
Colby his heirs or assigns forever all the right title interest and claim
which descended to him from his Father the said William Purvis Esq^r
in and to a certain tract or parcel of land situated in the County of
Pulaski and the waters of Buck Creek containing Fifty Acres to the same
more or less being the same tract of Land conveyed by Deed of gift
of James Purvis to said William Purvis Esq^r by deed now of
record in the clerks office of the Pulaski County Court & afterwards
conveyed by Deed of Conveyance from said James Purvis to John W.
Harris to the aforesaid John Colby Jr. and bounded as follows etc etc

Beginning at Hails corner & Black Oak thence his line
 N 25° E 90° poles to a white oak and Dogwood & a Sycamore line
 thence S. 87° W 30 poles to a White Oak & a bridge thence N.

 thence his line N. 68° W 110° poles to the Beginning
 the said John Collier do have and to hold said tract of land
 with all its Appurtenances and the said William Purvis hereby
 conveys quits claims & leases to said Collier all the interest
 in & to all land that descended to him from his Father the late

This Indenture

This Deed made this 28th of July 1851 between Andrew
 Newcomer Neuman and Mary Neuman his wife of the one part and George
 B. Hardin of the other part reciting partly that the said Andrew
 Neuman and Mary his wife for the consideration of Two hundred
 and fifty Dollars a part of which has heretofore been paid over for
 the balance (now) about \$100 besides public expenses lost & Milled
 Elliott now has a judgment for in the Pulaski Circuit Court hath
 granted a garnishment and sold and by these presents hath granted & bargained
 sell Enfield County Bank confirmed unto the said George B. Hardin
 and his heirs two certain lots of ground lying same in the
 Town of Somerset Ky. On Spring Street or Second Street a street
 South from the Square. And designated on the plat of said Town
 as lot 45 & 48. And is that part of said lots which lies between said
 Street and that part which lies bounded by communication of the
 Pulaski Circuit Court for and in behalf of John Brown to William West
 except that portion whereon rehels the Masonic Hall building & stands and
 the back of said building which is not bounded by this Deed and is
 the same lot heretofore sold and bounded by Jenkins Hickory & wife to
 said Newcomer by deed bearing date the 11th day of February 1845 to which
 last referred is here made for greater certainty
